EDUCATE, AGITATE, ORGANIZE!

9 to 5: Colin Higgins' 1980 comedy about three women who secretly kidnap and imprison their sexist, abusive boss and run their office in his stead certainly wasn't planned as an answer to The Pajama Game, but the two movies sure do make for a coincidentally interesting double feature. Dolly Parton's endlessly catchy theme song "9 to 5" easily outpaces any of the songs in the 1957 musical, but oth erwise, this film feels like an answer to the sexist assumptions about women's wants and roles in the earlier movie. 9 to 5 came out early in the era of the women's lib movement hitting the mainstream, and modern audiences may have a hard time believing how radical it seemed at the time as a fantasy about women seeking equal treatment in the workplace, rising to executive positions, and even introducing radical innovations like flextime and day care for employees. It's culturally dated, but it's still funny and resonant, with Lily Tomlin, Dolly Parton, and Jane Fonda.



A LOOK AHEAD
